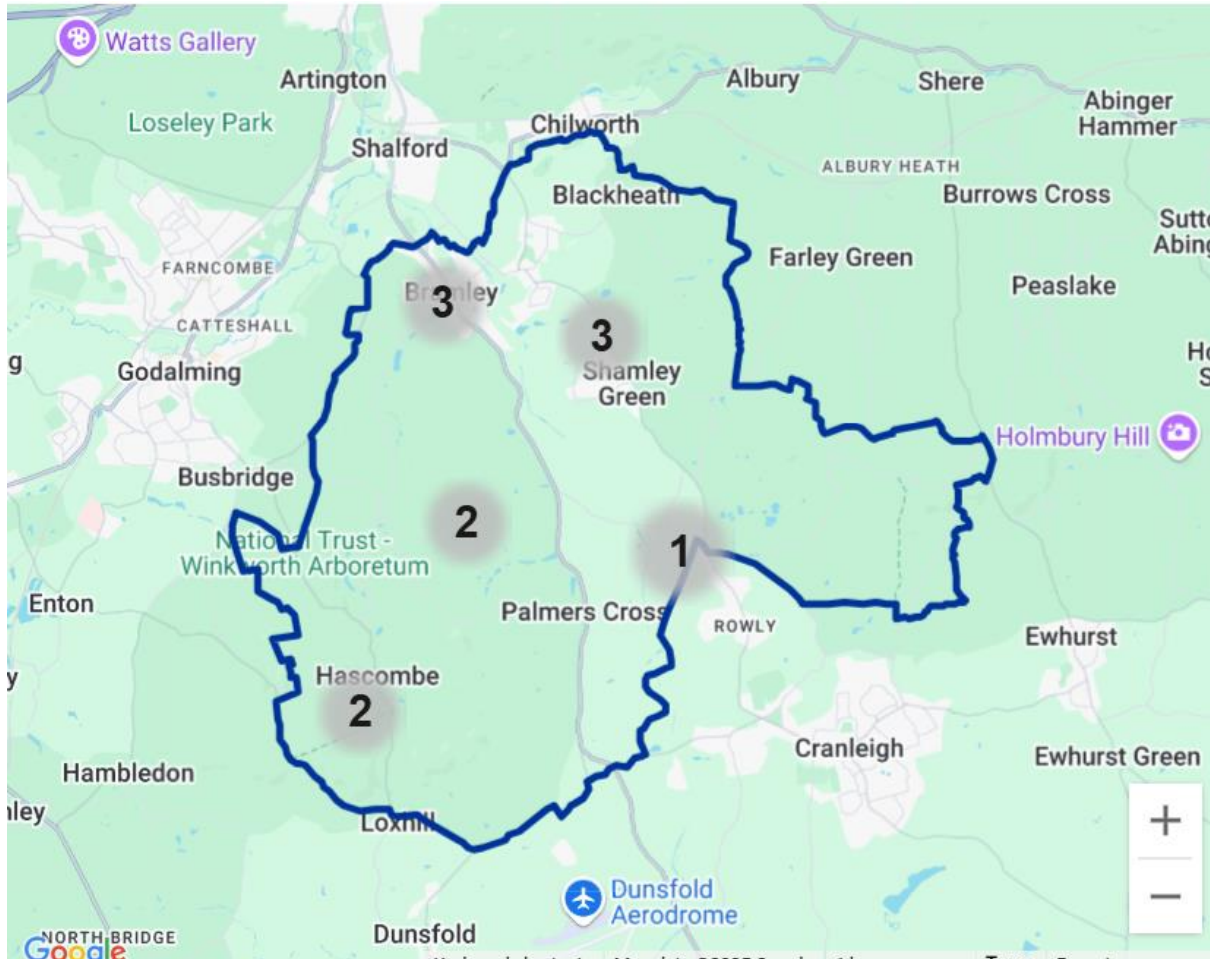
	Sender	Details	Clerk action or recommendation
