# WHAT'S HAPPENED?

#### **Bramley Parish Council update**

At the Parish Council meeting in September, a number of matters were discussed, including:

- SCC Cllr Kevin Deanus advised that the Government decision regarding the local government is due on October 15th and he hoped there wouldn't be any delays due to the recent government changes.
- Asda Community Fund Cllr B Stern reported that good progress had been made with approx £330k of the £512k fund being allocated.
  - He advised that work would start at Eastwood Road Playground on 15th September.
  - He also advised that the Gosden Housed Bakehouse Project had been completed, as had the Bramley Infant School Canopies project, the £30k donation had been made to the Wey & Arun Canal trust and that the first phase of the work at the Village Hall had been completed with the second phase due to start imminently.
- Cllrs agreed to set up a new sub committee to run the Bramley Sports Club.
