WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council update

At the Parish Council meeting in November, a number of matters were discussed, including:

- Surrey County Councillor Kevin Deanus stated that the HGV watch was now active in the area to the
 west of the A281. HGVs that breach the prohibition will receive warning letters from the police on the
 first and second occasion and will then be asked to attend a police interview on the third occasion. He
 pointed out that HGVs delivering to properties or belonging to businesses in the area were permitted
- Waverley Borough Councillor Jane Austin stated that the hubs in the village are working well at the
 Nest and the Village Hall but they are trying to find a suitable location for a mobile hub in the south of
 the village.
- Cllr Austin extended a big thank you from BPC to everyone especially Bramley Business Network who helped make the Christmas lights switch on such a success. She also said that the Thames Water works to the south of Bramley on the A281 were expected to be ongoing for 8 months.

 Speed Watch – There have been no speed watch sessions since the installation of the average speed check cameras. There needs to be a new speed watch set up from scratch with new volunteers. Cllr F Stern would assist in setting it up, the clerk will ask for volunteers in the next Bramley Update

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Bramley Fuel Leak Meeting - November 29th 2024 - Summary by Councillor Jane Austin

Thank you to the 135 people who attended and to St Catherine's School for hosting. Although the meeting felt more upbeat than previous ones there is still a way to go - in particular in tackling the hundreds without functioning telecommunications. The meeting was chaired by Jeremy Hunt MP and the panellists were Asda, EPS Environmental Consultants, Openreach, the EA and Waverley BC Recovery Group, with support from local Councillors.

The clean-up is progressing; of the 62 boreholes across the village only one now has floating fuel remaining in it. Colin Chiverton of the EA confirmed it will be years, not months, until the village is completely free of the petrol contamination. Following a multiphase clean -up in progress now the clean-up will eventually be completed via 'natural attenuation' over a period of years. Reassuringly Thames Water's ongoing testing results continue to come back clear. Openreach is still not able to access their network and there is frustration that there is still no workable solution for many people's connectivity issues. 3 satellite hubs have now been installed in the centre of the village which are helping support businesses. The businesses were not discussed in detail, but it was stated that to date 40 claims have been made and 4 payouts made.

There were a number of good questions from the floor including on compensation and on the clean up. Progress has been made with improved communications from all sides - here is the link to the Openreach presentation slides.
