WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council update

At the Parish Council meeting in December, a number of matters were discussed, including:

- Surrey County Councillor Kevin Deanus stated that National Policy Planning Framework had been published and he is expecting the Local Government Devolution White Paper and Financial Settlement Paper to be published shortly.
- Waverley Borough Councillor Jane Austin pointed out that they were all waiting for the Devolution White Paper as it will have an impact on all borough and parish councils as well as county councils.
- Asda Community Fund Cllr B Stern stated that the committee had been working hard towards the next meeting on 17th December.
 - Cllr Marshall advised that he has received over 40 suggestions from Bramley residents via the website, which will be considered at the meeting.
 - The first payments have been submitted to Asda but are awaiting settlement.
- Speed Watch The clerk has 3 volunteers to date, and she will put another request in the January Bramley Update as 10 are needed to establish a new group.

- Eastwood Road Playground Cllr Marshall stated that things were progressing well and that he had
 obtained a new quote which he will share with Cllrs in the next few days.
 Cllr Marshall is waiting for a response from WBC re his CIL funds application.
- Cllrs noted the draft 25/26 budget (circulated) and the majority voted to increase the precept for 2025/26 by 2% on the current year to £95,406

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

SGN - Urgent repair on the gas pipes in Horsham Road, Bramley.

SGN replace and repair the gas pipes in your area. This means they can continue to provide a safe and reliable gas supply to your community.

They need to repair the pipe by the petrol station in Horsham Road following their investigation in November. As the pipe is under the road, they will need to use traffic management to ensure the safety of everyone passing the work site.

This work will start on Monday 13 January for approximately four days. Although the work is expected to be completed within this timescale, engineering projects of this nature can take longer depending on our findings. Any changes will be notified via their <u>web page</u>.

To safely complete this work, they will need to temporarily close Snowdenham Lane at its junction with Horsham Road. Three-way temporary traffic lights will also be in place for the duration of the work. Access will be maintained for businesses and residents and a signed diversion route will be available.

SGN understand that a road closure causes inconvenience to the local community, and they will only use traffic management when necessary to keep everyone safe. Their working hours will be extended to reduce the disruption.

SGN are planning a 'drop in' for the local residential and business community to see the work plan and raise any concerns.

The 'drop in' has been arranged for Thursday 9 January from 2pm – 6pm at Bramley Village Hall, Hall Road, Bramley, Guildford GU5 OAX.

Bramley Village Hall

The Village Hall, situated in Hall Road, dates back to the 15th century and is a large tithe barn conversion with exposed medieval timbers. The hall is available for private hire at reasonable rates, with a discount for residents of Bramley parish. The main hall has tables available for use and provides seating for 130. There are 37 car parking spaces. Wheelchair facilities have been installed, there is a toilet for the disabled, and the main hall has been fitted with a hearing loop. Hire fees include use of the main hall, annexe, large well equipped kitchen, stage and toilets. Many activities take place in the hall, such as Yoga, Martial Arts, Junior Martial Arts, Pilates and Bridge Club etc. The venue is ideal for children's parties, dancing classes, quiz nights, jumble sales, etc. A separate meeting room, with its own toilet and galley kitchen facility, is also available for hire.
