WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council News:

- **Library Green upgrade** - on 10th February the overgrown fir trees will be felled ready for new trees to be planted as part of a wider project to landscape the area. More detail below.
- **New signs** - BPC and BVS hope you enjoy the new signs installed in the village, and notice boards which are undergoing rolling restoration / replacement.
- The **Park Drive application (WA/2025/00581)** for 26 homes previously refused in 2025 has now been appealed by the applicant - to add further comment and review the appeal documentation click [here](#). BPC has submitted further comment following review of appeal docs and retains its objection.
- **Potholes** - have all been reported and chased. Please help us if you see a pothole by reporting it using Surrey's online reporting tool [here](#).
- **Licence application Building A, Combe Farm Buildings, Alldens Lane – application by Pickle & Winch Ltd for a new premises licence - 31141** (formerly known as the Hilltop kitchen). Bramley PC has

objected to this application primarily on public safety grounds. Deadline for comments Expected to proceed as a Hearing in early March.

- **Missing Bus Stop Shelter opposite ASDA** - finally an installation date of 3rd March (weather and permits permitting) - a year after we lost it!
- **Eastwood Road playground** - Phase 2 including a refurbishment of the football area on track for installation for spring.
- **Chestnut Way Playground** - WBC re-turfed the area in early December and installed Heras fencing around the goal area to prevent use while the new turf becomes established. WBC has requested the fencing remains a couple more weeks.
- **Mill Lane Pond** - a new purchaser has installed a 3ft fence on the water line for safety reasons. BPC is working with the new owner to re-site the bin and bench to maintain use and enjoyment of the lake view.
- **Bramley Sports Pavilion** - Bramley Sports subcommittee are coming forward with options analysis and a recommendation to improve long term sports offer in the parish.
- **Local Government Reorganisation** - On 28th October Government confirmed Surrey will be reorganised into two unitary authorities, West and East. Bramley will fall into the West District. Elections will be held May 2026. For more information click [here for Surrey CC's updates](#) or here for [Waverley BC's latest update](#).
- **Fuel Leak** - following reports of odours in December 2025, fuel on the ground and continuing connectivity issues Chair Austin has requested an update from WBC and other stakeholders. Latest official updates [here](#).
- **Upcoming 20mph public consultation** Surrey County Council have held initial meetings about increasing road safety in the area via 20mph zones. We are awaiting more detail and a scope of proposed work.

Planning Appeal - Park Drive Application WA/2025/00581

The applicant has appealed previously refused application. To review the submitted appeal grounds and supporting documentation click [here](#). Bramley Parish Council is currently reviewing the appeal documentation and will share comments for submission in due course. Any comments made on the existing application will stand, but we would encourage you to review the additional information provided and submit additional comment to the Planning Inspectorate. The appeal reference is APP/R3650/W/25/3376467.

Re-landscaping the Area in Front of Bramley Library

We are pleased to announce the next phase of works to enhance the green space in front of Bramley Library. Following the installation of uplighting and supporting connections last year, the upcoming phase will include:

- Retaining the newly refurbished Jubilee sign
- Installing new benches
- Repairing the flagpoles
- Planting indigenous trees that are more in keeping with the character of a traditional English village

As part of these improvements, the two existing fir trees will be removed. These trees have grown too large for the site, and the necessary permission for their removal has been obtained. They will be replaced with more appropriate planting as part of the wider landscaping scheme.

We appreciate residents' patience while these works are carried out over the coming weeks and thank you for your understanding as we improve this important community space.
